PRINCIPLES OF IMPLEMENTATION

A. Course Delivery and Implementation Principles in Summer Term

(1) Summer term is an educational activity conducted during the summer months, outside of the fall and spring semesters, and aims to support students' education and training processes. Summer term is not considered a third semester of the relevant academic year.

(2) Summer term is optional. The duration of summer term is seven weeks, excluding exams. In courses offered in summer term, intensive instruction is provided for the total number of course hours in the fall or spring semester.

(3) The academic calendar for registration, courses, exams, and other implementation processes related to summer term is determined by the Senate and announced on the University's official website.

(4) Compulsory and elective courses to be offered in the summer semester are determined in accordance with the recommendation of the relevant faculty/college/vocational school board. A minimum of **6 (six)** students must register for a course to be offered. Courses that do not reach the determined minimum number of students will not be offered.

(5) Courses offered in the summer semester at Haliç University cannot be taken from the summer semester of another higher education institution.

(6) To take a course from the summer semester of another higher education institution, the student's central placement base score for the relevant program in the year they were admitted to the University must be equal to or higher than the base score of the relevant program at the higher education institution where the course is taken in the same year. In foundation higher education institutions, the comparison is made based on the non-scholarship base score of the relevant

program. For programs that admit students through special talent exams or without exams; the criteria to be applied to students admitted through horizontal/vertical transfer and those with international student status are determined separately by the Senate upon the recommendation of the relevant Unit Board.

(7) Students who wish to take a course not offered in Haliç University's summer semester from another higher education institution's summer semester must apply to their registered department/program head, attaching to their application the information of the higher education institution and department/program they wish to take the course from, the academic calendar for the summer semester, the learning outcomes, content, course hours, and ECTS information of the relevant course, and their current transcript.

(8) The student's application is evaluated by the relevant commission using the "Summer School Course Enrollment Application Evaluation Form (ÖİD.FR.001)". Following the commission's evaluation, the approval of the department/program head is obtained, and the application is finalized by the decision of the relevant faculty/school/vocational school's administrative board. Courses cannot be taken from another higher education institution's summer semester without the approval of the relevant unit's administrative board. Courses taken without the approval of the administrative board will not be accepted, regardless of success status, and will not be recorded in the Student Information System (ÖBS).

(9) It is essential that courses taken by Haliç University students from another higher education institution within the scope of the summer semester are conducted through face-to-face education methods. Courses conducted online, in a hybrid format, or using similar methods are not accepted; courses taken in this way will not be recorded in the student's academic records.

(10) Grades from courses taken at other higher education institutions that correspond to a letter grade below CC at the University are not accepted.

(11) For courses taken from another higher education institution's summer semester due to the course not being offered at Haliç University, the national and ECTS credits must be equal to or greater than the national and ECTS credits of the equivalent course.

(12) The time spent in summer semesters for associate and undergraduate programs is not taken into account in the calculation of the normal education period and the maximum study period.

(13) Students can take courses in summer semesters that correspond to a maximum of 10% of the total ECTS load required for graduation in their registered program. Students in Double Major Programs (DMP) can take a maximum of 12 ECTS credits from the double major program in addition to their major program; students in minor programs can take a maximum of 6 ECTS credits from the minor program.

(14) Students enrolled in a program can retake courses in the summer semester that they have not previously taken, failed, or wish to retake to improve their GPA. Students with a GPA of at least 2.50 can take a maximum of two courses from higher semesters/years. Students who have failed or never taken courses from lower semesters/years can only benefit from this right by registering for those courses first.

(15) Students can register for courses in the summer semester that do not have prerequisites or for which they have already met the prerequisites.

(16) In the Faculty of Medicine, no courses are offered in the summer semester except those offered by the Distance Education Coordination Office.

(17) Students are required to attend summer term courses even if they have already met the attendance requirements for previous courses. Students who do not meet the attendance requirements for a course in the summer term cannot take the final exam for that course and will be considered unsuccessful due to absenteeism.

(18) Simultaneous registration is not possible for courses with conflicting schedules in the summer term. Schedule conflicts are checked during course registration, and registration for conflicting courses is not permitted.

(19) Foreign language courses to be taken from within the university or from outside the institution within the scope of summer education can only be taken in the foreign language in which the course is offered and conducted.

(20) Courses offered by the Distance Education Coordination Office are conducted online; exams for these courses are held in person. Apart from this, all courses offered in the summer term, including midterm and final exams, are held in person, including those offered by the English Preparatory School.

(21) English Preparatory School students must apply to the Directorate of the School of Foreign Languages to register for modules offered in the summer term.

(22) Summer semester fees are determined based on tuition fees for the relevant academic year and are applied according to the amounts listed in the relevant fee schedule.

(23) No scholarships or discounts are applied to summer semester tuition fees. Students enrolled in summer semester tuition will not receive a refund for non-attendance, failure, or similar reasons. However, if a chosen course is not offered, the tuition fee for that course will be refunded. If none of the chosen courses are offered, the entire summer semester tuition fee will be refunded.

B. Success Status, Grading, Single Course Exams, and Maximum Entitlements

(1) The provisions of the Haliç University Associate and Undergraduate Education and Training Regulations shall apply to the evaluation of courses offered in summer semester and the determination of success and attendance status.

(2) Final year students who have more than one course remaining for graduation after make-up exams may take a single-course exam on a date determined by the academic units, provided they reduce the number of remaining courses to one by taking courses in the summer semester and also meet the other requirements stipulated in the Regulations for single-course exams.

(3) Students who do not attend or fail summer semester exams (midterm and final exams) without a valid excuse will not be given another exam opportunity. Courses failed in the summer term are retaken in the following academic term when they are offered.

(4) Students who have completed their maximum study period at the end of the relevant academic year may take courses in the summer term of the relevant academic year.

(5) The time spent in the summer term is not taken into account in the calculation of the student's maximum study period.

(6) Grades for courses taken in the summer term are entered into the Student Information System (SIS) in accordance with the relevant legislation.

D. Information for Guest Students Wishing to Take Courses at Haliç University During the Summer Term:

(1) Guest students wishing to take courses during the summer term should select the courses they wish to take from the courses announced on the University's official website and apply to the relevant faculty/school/vocational school secretariat.

(2) Course registration is carried out by the Student Affairs Directorate in accordance with the decision of the relevant faculty/school/vocational school's administrative board. Fulfillment of financial obligations is mandatory for course registration to be finalized.

(3) Students studying at other universities who register for Haliç University's summer term are issued a document showing the duration of the summer term, the course code, name, hours, credit (ECTS), and grade of the courses taken. This document is sent to the relevant higher education institution where the student is registered, upon the decision of the relevant School/Faculty Administrative Board. A certified copy of the document is given to the student upon request.

(4) Summer semester fees are determined based on tuition fees for the relevant academic year and are applied according to the amounts listed in the relevant fee schedule.
